

Village of Jacksonville Council Meeting
August 17, 2022
6:30 PM

The Village of Jacksonville met in regular session with Mayor Sam Smathers presiding and the meeting called to order at 6:30 PM. Council members present were Jay Chapman, Butch Chapman, Clinton Augustine, and Gary Simons. Also present were Fiscal Officer Heather Rockwell, Administrator Ron Rockwell, and Interim Fire Chief DJ Henry.

Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to excuse Councilpersons Rachel Gratz and Angela Strock from the August 17, 2022 meeting. Seconded by Councilperson Augustine. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Councilperson Jay Chapman made a motion to approve the July 28, 2022 Regular Council Minutes as read. Seconded by Councilperson Butch Chapman. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Interim Fire Chief DJ Henry reported that there have been 2 fire runs for the month of August. The mirror on unit 1771 has been replaced, but the truck still needs a replacement heater core. One new junior firefighter has been added to the roster and a new application for a firefighter has been received. The July firefighter training was cancelled due to the broken mirror on unit 1771. A search and rescue training is scheduled for August 28, 2022. The brush truck and boat trailer will be used on August 21, 2022 for York's Kids Day in Buchtel. Council stated the street will be swept prior to the Old Settlers Reunion and they do not want the street hosed off as it will clog the storm drains.

Administrator Rockwell reported that he and Ron Riley have been mowing throughout the Village, finishing construction at the Village Hall and have put down two tons of hot mix on street repairs with more hot mix coming soon.

Fiscal Officer Rockwell presented Council with the July 2022 Monthly Financial Statements and Bank Reconciliation. Rockwell requested a motion to approve the June Financial Statements presented at the July 28, 2022 meeting. Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to approve the June 2022 financial statements as presented. Seconded by Councilperson Simons. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Fiscal Officer Rockwell presented for Supplemental Appropriations to complete the PEP+ Grant purchases and replace damaged speed bumps. Rockwell informed Council that the salt spreader and spare parts have been ordered and there is no delay expected in delivery. Rockwell stated that documentation indicates that Tenth Street was abandoned for the first thirty-five feet off State Route 13. Rockwell provided Council with an update on the 2022 Paving Project including the streets that are to be submitted, the traffic count that is currently underway, the deadline for the application and the potential date to know if the grant is awarded. Rockwell will keep Council updated on the status of the project.

Councilperson Butch Chapman referred Council to the Street Committee Meeting Minutes for the August 15 meeting included in Council's packets. Chapman stated the road closures for the Old Settler's Reunion were discussed at length by the committee with representatives of the Old Settlers Reunion Committee present. Chapman stated the Old Settlers Reunion Committee agrees with the proposed road closures. Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to close Sixth Street from State Route 13 to Railroad Street with one lane open for access to the Post Office and the Village garage and fuel pumps beginning Tuesday, August 30 at 6:30PM. From Wednesday, August 31 through Friday, September 2 school buses will use Fifth Street as an alternate route and all other traffic will use Fifth Street to travel south and Seventh Street to travel north from the hours of 6AM-9AM and 2PM-4PM. Alleys between Fifth and Sixth Streets and Sixth and Seventh Streets will be closed during these hours to prevent overuse. Sixth Street will reopen on Monday, September 5 at 6:30PM. The Old Settler's Committee will be responsible for opening and closing the roadways at the agreed upon dates and

times. The Old Settlers Committee will create and distribute flyers notifying residents of a Cruise-In on Fifth Street on September 3 from 10AM-3PM. Village fire trucks will assist with blocking traffic during the parade on Saturday, September 5 beginning at 9:30AM. The parade route will be along Palmer Street starting at Seventh Street, west on Palmer Street, north on Fifth Street, east on State Route 13 and end at Ninth Street. Seconded by Councilperson Augustine. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried

Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to remove any usable equipment from the Village 2003 Chevy 2500 HD truck and scrap the truck body. Seconded by Councilperson Jay Chapman. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to appoint DJ Henry as Fire Chief and Brett Downs as Assistant Fire Chief. Seconded by Councilperson Augustine. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.



Motion carried. Resolution 2022-28: Resolution Accepting the Amounts and Rates as Determined by the Budget Commission and Authorizing the Necessary Tax Levies and Certifying Them to the County Auditor. Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to adopt Resolution 2022-28 as read. Seconded by Councilperson Jay Chapman. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to suspend the rules and read by title only Ordinance 2022-29 declaring an emergency. Seconded by Councilperson Jay Chapman. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried. Ordinance 2022-29: 2022 Supplemental Permanent Appropriations and Declaring an Emergency. Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to adopt Ordinance 2022-29 as read. Seconded by Councilperson Augustine. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried.

Mayor Smathers entertained a motion to adjourn.

Councilperson Butch Chapman made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Councilperson Augustine. All Council voted "yes". Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:07P.
